Security Export Control System in Japan

The Security Export Control in Japan is implemented for the purpose of enabling proper development of foreign trade, and maintaining peace and safety in Japan as well as in the international community by exercising the minimum necessary control based on the FEFTA (Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Act) under international export control regimes.

With regards to exporting our products, please follow The Security Export Control in Japan. Make sure to check Foreign User's list issued by METI (Ministry of Economy, Trade Industry). FEFTA also sets forth catch-all control for items which could contribute to WMD (Weapons of Mass Distraction) related or military end-use activities.

The exporter has the responsibility to classify whether the export item is subject to control list. As a result of the classification, if it is found that the item is covered by the control list, it must apply for export license to the METI. METI examines the appropriateness of the end-use and the end-user of the license application, and decides whether to permit or deny the application. Additional conditions may be imposed on export licenses (e.g., monitoring of export machines, prior consent in the case of the re-transfer of items.).

The exporter has the responsibility to act in accordance with the law comply with the U.S. Export Administration Regulations (EAR).

If there is any doubt, we request the exporter for investigation reports.
